No junkyard, whether for automobiles, machinery or other junk equipment, shall be operated, and no license shall be issued for such a business, provided this section shall not apply to junk dealers who

Sec. 8-44. Types prohibited.

- (a) It shall be unlawful to employ or use any persons to solicit patrons therefor, by going upon the streets and accosting pedestrians or occupants of vehicles, either verbally or by means of signs or any other device whatsoever.
- (b) It shall be unlawful for any person acting as agent of any said establishment to accost pedestrians or occupants of motor vehicles upon the streets, either verbally, by means of signs or any other device whatsoever, to solicit such persons to become occupants or patrons thereof.
